Telehandler Training Courses BC - Employers are responsible for making certain that their operating personnel and supervisors are trained to work competently using telehandler machinery. The skill level of staff must be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that staff get the necessary level of skill. The responsibility level of the individual should be considered when training is provided. Effective training will solve whichever deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training may be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

State/Provincial, local and federal regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of people, the lifting of suspended loads, making use of different attachments, or the utilization of rotating machinery. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work site.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler needs routine maintenance similar to any other machine. The machinery would wear out eventually, so proper maintenance is required to ensure the safe operation of the telehandler equipment. Inspections and checks are important to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators should have machine-specific training in order to rectify, monitor and prevent problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Workers need competence and experience in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance directions of the manufacturer should be viewed seriously and followed, taking into consideration such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The responsibility for making certain that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the owner and the user of the equipment. Pre-use checks are normally carried out by the user, while general maintenance is usually carried out by the telehandler owner.
